

In 2021, Basque public institutions disbursed €74,253,567¹, earmarked for international development cooperation initiatives, which represents a 10.41% increase from 2020.

The Basque Government is the agent with the largest contributions, accounting for 71.38% of the funds in 2021, mainly through eLankidetza-Basque Agency for Development Cooperation.



There are also other municipalities that have budgetary lines on cooperation that they manage directly, the data of which are not registered in the Portal.

During 2021, the funds channelled by Euskal Fondoa were mostly linked to projects dealing with Water supply and sanitation (€1,570,907; 62.1%), Government and civil society initiatives (€373,885; 14.78%) and Emergency aid (€288,211; 11.39%).

### Funds disbursed by modalities 2021




In 2021, 62.73% of funds disbursed went to the Development cooperation modality, followed by Humanitarian and emergency action with 18.52% of the funds.

The modality of Education for social transformation, which is a characteristic of decentralised cooperation, accounted 11.27% of the funds. It includes educational, communication, cultural, research processes and actions, etc. aimed at fostering a critical citizenship that is aware of inequalities, as well as promoting equitable and supportive practices that generate indiviaul and collective changes.




### Funds disbursed in Education for social transformation 2021

#### **Intervention strategy**




Of the resources disbursed in the modality of Education for social transformation (€8,370,415), more than half (64.44%) went to Training and Awareness-raising strategies. Informal and Formal education were the sphere of action that received most of this funds (76.37%).

# Funds disbursed by geographical area and country 2021




Of the funds allocated to the Development cooperation and Humanitarian and emergency action modalities (€60,331,500), the Americas (including North, South and Central America and the Caribbean) was the geographical area that received the largest volume of funds in 2021 (55.49%).

The 15 countries that received the most funds were earmarked 69.61% of the total funds.

### Funds disbursed by sector 2021



Of the funds allocated to the Development cooperation and Humanitarian and emergency action modalities (€60,331,500), 76.04% are distributed among three DAC sectors: Government and civil society, Humanitarian aid, and Production sectors.



## Funds disbursed according to the type of channelling entity 2021



The funds disbursed in the modalities of Development cooperation, Humanitarian and emergency action, and Education for social transformation, totalling €68,701,915, were mainly channelled by NGDOs in the Basque Country (82.69%).



## Funds disbursed according to the type of local partner 2021

76% of the funds disbursed in Development cooperation and Humanitarian and emergency action modalities (€60,331,500) are implemented in collaboration with local NGOs in the partner country, being the Public local entities the next most common type of local partner (8.92%).

The "Not applicable" category group includes projects of the aforementioned modalities that do not have a local partner, or are implemented directly by the channelling entity, which may be an NGDO or social entity in the destination country, an international NGO, or an NGDO or social entity in the Basque Country.
